DEATH SUMMONED

ANTHONY BLAES

DURING MORNING

**WIDELY KNOWN BELLEVUEAN
SUCCUMBED AFTER 10 DAYS
CRITICAL ILLNESS.**

Death wrote "finis" to the life history of a widely known Bellevue man this morning when Anthony Blaes passed away at 7:30 o'clock in the family home on Broad street. Death followed ten days of "critical illness," climaxing an extended period of impaired health.

Mr. Blaes had been practically a life-long resident of Bellevue and was long identified with business, fraternal and other circles, in which groups his geniality won for him a legion of close friends and acquaintances. At the time of his death he was proprietor of a billiard hall in the Wilson block.

Fraternally he was affiliated with the Bellevue lodge of Elks, Bellevue Aerie of Eagles, Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen and Mutual Aid Society.

Mr. Blaes was a native of Frank, having been born in the community south of Bellevue, March 14, 1883, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Blaes, and for a period of years during his earlier life was a resident of Tennessee. Aside from this he had spent his entire life here.

On May 8, 1912, he was united in marriage here to Miss Mary Weeston, who, with three daughters, Madeline, Mildred and Martha, and one sister, Mrs. Charles Glassner, residing at Akron, survive.

Funeral services will be conducted Tuesday morning at 9:30 from the Immaculate Conception Catholic church, and burial will be in the Catholic cemetery.
