Mrs. Bertha B. HILAND, 81, 1209 Franklin Avenue, a Rochester resident for many years died at 10:15 o'clock this morning at Woodlawn hospital of uremic poisoning. She had been ill about 10 days.

Born in Marshall County on Dec. 28, 1876, Mrs. Hiland lived at one time on the Bailey farm southwest of Rochester, moving from there to Franklin Avenue in 1941.

She was the daughter of Daniel and Martha STURGEON FRY.

Her first marriage was on Dec. 27, 1894 to Alvin Baker POLLEY, who preceded her in death.

On Sept. 30, 1939, she was married to Charles A. HILAND, who died in 1955.

Mrs. Hiland was a housewife and member of the Rochester church of God.

Surviving are three sons, Perry POLLEY, Plymouth, Ernest [POLLEY], Chesterton, Ind. and Marion [POLLEY], Toledo, Ohio.; four daughters, Mrs. Ralph (Mable) ALDERFER and Mrs. Charles (Arvilla) QUACKENBUSH, both of Rochester, Mrs. Donald (Sylvia) MYERS, Plymouth, and Mrs. Leonard (Rhoda) ZENSEN, Laporte.

Also eleven grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren. A daughter Elsie [POLLEY], died in 1919.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday in the Rochester Church of God with the pastor, the Rev. C. J. MOWRER officiating. Burial will be in the Citizens cemetery at Culver.
