Charles M. Quackenbush

Charles M. QUACKENBUSH, 83, of 500 W. Seventh St., died at 9:30 p.m. Wednesday [22 Apr 1981] at Woodlawn Hospital where he had been a patient for 3 1/2 weeks. He had been in failing health the past four years.

Mr. Quackenbush was born March 8, 1898 in Newberry to Mathew and Eliza SCOMP QUACKENBUSH.

He had lived here the past 30 years, moving from Newberry.

He was married April 29, 1944 in Athens to Arvilla POLLEY, who died Nov. 28, 1968. He was later married Dec. 31, 1969 in Rochester to Vada BARTS, who survives.

He retired July 6, 1967 after 51 years with the Erie-Lackawanna Railway. He was a member of the Rochester First Church of God. He was the treasurer of the Prill School Association for the past 10 years. He was a 20-year county chairman for the Fulton County Conservation Club. He also authored a children's book entitled "Sam".

Surviving with the wife are a daughter, Mrs. Dalton (Virginia) KINDIG, Mesa, Ariz.; three granddaughters, Mrs. Tom (Pamela) WHITTENDALE, Dover, Del.; Mrs. Christina LAHPI, Farmington, N.M., and Mrs. Roger (Jayne) PEACOCK, Winslow, Ariz.; five great-grandchildren; a sister, Mrs. W. H. (Dorothy) WINZENREAD, Indianapolis. A daughter, Beth [QUACKENBUSH], four sisters and two brothers preceded in death.
