

Dr. John Rothacker Enters Medical Missionary Work

John P. Rothacker, D. D. S., son of Mr. and Mrs. William Rothacker, 908 Carbon street, entered the medical field. At present he is part in 'Project Compassion', a medical missionary program of Bob Jones university, Greenville, S. C.

Dr. Rothacker, a honor graduate of high-school, class of 1944, spent four years in the U.S. Army following graduation. He attended Ohio State University, graduating in 1963 from the College of Dentistry. He had one year of internship at the Children's hospital in Columbus. In September of 1964 he decided the missionary field was to be his work. He is a member of the Calvary Bible church, Columbus, and when visiting his parents attends the Christian and Missionary Alliance church, Sixth street.

Those working in the missionary training program are stationed at St. Lucia, an island about 1600-miles southeast of Miami, Fla., a part of the British West Indies. The island is poor and overcrowded with a population of 100,000 on its 27-mile-long and 16-mile-wide area. A prevalence of illiteracy, disease and superstition abound there.

Dr. Rothacker is working on

a team of 23 missionaries and nurses, headed by Dr. John Dreisbach, orthopedic surgeon and campus physician and Mrs. Dreisbach, a registered nurse. The doctor has spent 12 years in the medical missionary field in West Africa.

The Fremont dentist has charge of all dental work and team evangelism while he is learning to live in a foreign country and adapt to the many other orientation problems.
