GERALD J. "JERRY" WILL, 78, died at 12:50 p.m. Jan. 29, 2000, at Van Wert County Hospital, Van Wert.

He was born Sept. 11, 1921, in Delphos to Hilary J. and Hilda Rose Will. On July 12, 1943, he married Rose G. Korb, who died March 22, 1996. On April 18, 1998, he married Virginia Buet-

tner Christian, who survives.

Mr. Will was a pharmacist and had owned Stallkamp Drugs, Delphos, since 1976. He was a councilman for 39 years, had served as president, and was a former mayor of Delphos. He was a member of St. John's Catholic Church, Delphos. He was Scoutmaster of Troop 42 for 25 years and a member of Knights of Columbus, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and Fraternal Order of Eagles. He was a member of the Northwest Ohio, Ohio State associations and the American Pharmacy Society and the National Retail Drug Association. He was a member of the Allen County Historical Society. He was a former member of Kiwanis Club. He was a 1939 graduate of St. John's High School and a 1950 graduate of the Ohio Northern University School of Pharmacy. He was an Army Air Corps veteran of World War II, serving in the 8th Air Force, 100th Bomb Group, in England.

Survivors also include two sons, Gerald J. (Joe) Will Jr. of Baltimore, Md., and Dave (Becky) Christen of Delphos; seven daughters, Mary Ann (Ray) Schuck, Theresa (Alden) Bradstock, Frances (Richard) Schuck, Audrey (Phill) Davis, Beth (Ralph) Horsten and Anne (Jim) Hefner, all of Delphos, and Helen (Carl) Chiteman of Medina; two brothers, Bernard Will of Delphos and Jim Will of Arlington, Texas; three sisters, Bernadine Will and Pat Holden, both of Delphos, and Ruth Morgan of Modesto, Calif.; 12 grandchildren and a great-grandchild.

He was preceded in death by a brother, Anthony Schmidt.

Mass of Christian Burial will begin at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at St. John Catholic Church. Burial will be in Resurrection Cemetery, Delphos, with military rites by Delphos Veterans Council.
