

HENRY J. HOSMAN, 85, FALLS DEAD IN YARD

Rites to be Held Friday Morning at Reed

Henry J. Hosman, 85, retired Reed township farmer, died suddenly Monday, June 17, 1946 at 1:15 p. m. at the home of his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Albert Hahl of Reed, with whom he and Mrs. Hosman had made their home for the past year.

Mr. Hosman was critically ill some time ago, but had partially recovered. His death yesterday was very sudden. He had gone out into the yard after the noon meal and was found dead a short time later.

Mr. and Mrs. Hosman celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary last month at their daughter's home. They had moved from their own farm home following his illness.

Born January 20th, 1862 in Norwich township, to Henry and Anna ^{MISSLER}Wessler Hosman, he was married May 4, 1886 in Reed Assumption church to Mary Schreiner.

Surviving are five daughters and a son, including Mrs. Earl Crist and Edward Hosman, both of this city. Others are Mrs. Anna Gerber, Sandusky; Mrs. Gertrude Schoen, Reed; Mrs. Hahl, with whom he resided, and Mrs. Frank Roth, Fostoria. Two daughters are deceased. There are 22 grandchildren and nine great grandchildren.

Mr. Hosman was a member of Reed Assumption church and the Holy Name society.

Funeral services will be held Friday at 9:30 a. m. at Reed Assumption church, with the Rev. Francis Krull officiating. Burial will be made in the adjoining cemetery.

The body will be taken to the residence from the Foos funeral home, Bellevue, this evening. Friends may call after 7 o'clock.
