

Joe Sterner Died Monday

Funeral Today For Former Deputy Sheriff, Ill For Years

Joseph A. Sterner, 51, former Sandusky county deputy sheriff, died Monday, July 16, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. F. P. Baker on Grant St. where he and his wife had made their home for the past seven years.

The body was taken to the Fiser Funeral Home where services will be held this afternoon at 2:30 conducted by the Rev. W. Q. Halverson, followed by burial in McPherson Cemetery.

Mr. Sterner was a native of Weaver's Corners, a son of Isaac D. and Mary E. Korb Sterner. He was born March 24, 1894, was reared in that vicinity and attended the Belleve schools. Dec. 24, 1925 he was married to Gladys Miller of Clyde, and their married life has been spent in Fremont and Clyde.

During World War I he served overseas as master signal sergeant with Headquarters. Following the war, he for many years was a Sandusky county deputy sheriff. He was a member of Edgar Thurston Post of the American Legion at Fremont, of the 46 and 8 at Fremont, and of the Eagles.

During the past seven years he had been in falling health and with his wife had travelled to Florida and Arizona in search of help. For the week before his death, he had failed rapidly.

He is survived by his widow, 3 sisters, Mrs. Ella Landgraf and Mrs. Rosa Hanger of South Bend, Ind., and Mrs. Gertrude Lyons of Millford, Ill., by a brother, Anthony Sterner of South Bend, 3 nieces and 3 nephews.

Funeral services for Joseph A. Sterner, 51, former well-known Sandusky county deputy sheriff, and veteran of World War I who died July 16, were held Thursday, July 19, at the Fiser Funeral Home, and were widely attended.

The services were conducted by the Rev. W. Q. Halverson of Clyde Presbyterian Church, and burial was made in McPherson Cemetery. Serving as pall bearers were Sheriff H. L. Myers, Frank Buehler, Albert Steinle, Joseph Forgatsch and Mark W. Bowers of Fremont, and A. E. Klotz of Gibsonburg. A firing squad and bugler from Camp Perry were here for a military burial at the Cemetery.
