

Death Takes Dr. Krupp

Medic 59 Stricken
at Paris Meet

Dr. Christian G. Krupp, 59, of 2161 Fulton st., E, physician here 32 years, died Monday evening at Blodgett Memorial hospital after suffering a heart attack at a meeting on annexation in Paris township.

Earlier in the meeting, held in the township auditorium at Forty-fourth st. and Kalamazoo av., SE, he spoke about 10 minutes opposing annexation.

Dr. Krupp was honored in 1952 by the late Pope Pius XII with knighthood in the order of St. John Lateran, for his work and efforts in sponsoring two orphanages in Italy and for his research on socialized medicine.

Studies in Europe.

He had made two trips to Europe to investigate various phases of medicine there.

Dr. Krupp was widely known here for his stands on civic issues, including opposition to fluoridation of municipal water supplies.

A native of Smyrna, he graduated from Belding High school.

Alma college and Loyola Medical school in Chicago, interning at St. Mary's hospital here.

He took postgraduate medical work at the University of Michigan hospital, at Cook county hospital and at the Crell clinic in Cleveland.

Practiced 32 Years.

He had had heart illness and was semi-retired the last three years.

Formerly a member of the Knights of Columbus, he also was a member of St. Thomas church and of its Holy Name society.

Surviving are his wife, Mary E.; three sons, Charles, George and James; and two daughters, Miss Bernadette and Mrs. Raymond Bushier, all of Grand Rapids; two sisters, Mrs. Rufus Waldron of Hastings and Mrs. Dorothy Bristol of Belding; and a brother, Frank Krupp of Hastings.

The body will be at the residence until funeral services at 10 a. m. Thursday in St. Thomas church. Burial will be in Woodlawn cemetery. Arrangements are by Alt mortuary.
