

URBAN KRUPP DIES SUDDENLY IN HOME

Was Loomis Employee For 30 Years

Urban J. Krupp, 52, superintendent of the Loomis Machine Company shop, died suddenly at 2:30 a. m. Dec. 1, 1943, in his home at 48 West Market street. His death is attributed to angina pectoris.

Mr. Krupp was born in Tiffin, June 27, 1891, to Anthony and Rose (Fisher) Krupp. He was employed by the Loomis Machine Company for 30 years and in recent years had been superintendent for the company. He was married Feb. 4, 1913 to Sophie Schanz and is survived by his wife, two daughters, Sr. Mary Urban, Ursuline Convent, Toledo; and Mrs. Raymond Wasserman, Tiffin; the following brothers and sisters: Charles, Albert, Ralph, and Mrs. William Beechner, all of Tiffin; William, Port Clinton; Paul, Muskegon, Mich.; and a half sister, Mrs. Clara Smith, Water Falls, Mich.; and one grandchild, Mary Ann Wasserman.

Mr. Krupp was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church, and of the Knights of Columbus, the Knights of St. John, and the United Commercial Travelers.
