SHERMAN TOWNSHIP FARMER IS DEAD

SERVICES FOR MARTIN SCHREINER WILL BE CONDUCTED SATURDAY MORNING.

A six months' illness with dropsy and neuralgia of the heart terminated fatally for Martin Schreiner, 75, prominent Sherman township farmer, Wednesday, when he succumbed in the home of his daughter, Mrs. Joseph Elmlinger, in Havana.

Funeral services are to be held in St. Sebastian's church at Bismark on Saturday morning at 9 o'clock, with the Rev. Nicholas Traunero in charge. Burial will be in the parish cemetery.

Mr. Schreiner's death followed an illness of six months with dropsy and neuralgia of the heart.

A son of John and Frances Schreiner, he was born December 6, 1860, in Reed township. He was married to Miss Anna Krupp, who survives with their six children: Anthony, Battle Creek, Mich.; Herman, Carey; Mrs. Katie Clouse, Bismark; Mrs. Olga Brickner, Bascom; Mrs. Yost, Los Angeles, Calif.
