Kun, Hungarian Red Leaders, Held Moscow Declares

MOSCOW, Oct. 20—The official Communist Internationale magazine asserted today that Bela Kun, world famous Hungarian Communist leader, had been arrested.

The Communist Internationale magazine, in disclosing today that Kun, leader of the Communist revolution in Hungary after the World war, and dictator of the country during the short-lived Communist republic, had been arrested, said he was charged with "Trotskyist" activities which undermined the popular front in Hungary.

Such charges as this usually mean the death penalty, and it was believed likely that the stormy career of the Hungarian leader was near its end.

As Bela Kun's arrest was disclosed, announcement of death sentences on 70 more "enemies of the regime" brought the known total of deaths in the purge to 1,031, according to a United Press tabulation from published reports.
