# THEODORE THIERY DIED TODAY AT HOSPITAL HERE

## INJURIES RECEIVED IN AUTOMOBILE - ACCIDENT TUESDAY CAUSE DEATH.

After having lingered in an unconscious state since Tuesday morning, when he was fatally injured in a collision between an automobile in which he was a passenger and a Nickel Plate train, Theodore Thiery, aged 40, of Frank, died early this morning at Bellevue hospital. Two sons of the victim and a hired man, who also were occupants of the automobile at the time of the collision, escaped without serious injuries.

Little hope for recovery of Mr. Thiery was entertained at any time after he became a patient at Bellevue hospital, examination by physicians disclosing his injuries to have been of a nature which were expected to cause death.

Mr. Thiery was a life-long resident of this vicinity and at the time of his death was a resident of Frank, south of Bellevue. He was engaged in the strawbaling business and was of an industrious nature and claimed many close friends to whom word of his injuries and subsequent death came as a severe shock.

Surviving are a wife and six children, Loretta, Charloita, Theodore, Elmer, Edward and Olena, all at home.

The deceased was a lifelong and faithful member of the Catholic church.

The funeral will be held Monday morning from the Frank Catholic church, Rev. Faist officiating. Interment will be at the Catholic cemetery in Frank.
