They were told that it is important that the benzene hexachloride dust is not applied where it will drift into fields where livestock is being pastured or may be present within three weeks, since the chemical is poisonous to stock. It can be applied safely to hay meadows, but care must be taken to cause the chemical to become less by the time the hay is cured.

In the dusting process the flies close to the ground, and this morning flew under the wires on the edge of the field where he was applying the chemical.
