RETIRED FIREMAN CALLED BY DEATH

Rites to be Saturday for Lewis N. Krupp

Lewis Nicholas Krupp, 81, retired stationary fireman, died at 7 p.m. Tuesday in his home at 171 Fourth avenue. He had been afflicted with a heart ailment for years, and a heart attack resulted in his death.

Mr. Krupp was born Jan. 25, 1866 at Franks and was a son of Nicholas and Anna Krupp. He was married in March, 1891 to Belle Ann Taylor and is survived by his wife, five of their seven children; Jesse, Pennshoro, W. Va.; DeForest, Toledo; Mrs. Zula Birch, Alvin, and Orlin, all of Tiffin; a brother, Joseph, Lorain; and 15 grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.
