DIED WHILE ON VISIT

At Home of His Daughter in This City.

Nicholas Krupp, a prominent resident of Thompson township, died at the home of his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Clase Ross, on Union street Monday morning at about 5:30, after a short illness from paralysis. Mr. Krupp came to this city about a week ago to visit Mr. and Mrs. Ross and on last Tuesday he was stricken with paralysis. His condition gradually became worse and this morning he was found dead in bed.

The deceased was born in Germany and was aged 78 years and 6 months. He was a blacksmith by trade and had resided in Thompson township for a number of years. Surviving him are the following six children: Louis Krupp, of Republic; Jacob Krupp, of Unionville; John Krupp, of Old Fort; Daniel and Joseph Krupp, of Lorain, and Mrs. Clase Ross, of this city. The body will be taken to Thompson township for burial.
