

SOLOMON A. KRUPP DIES UNEXPECTEDLY

Underwent Surgery in Toledo Wednesday

Solomon A. Krupp, 50, former Tiffin resident and member of the old Second Regiment band, died unexpectedly this morning in Toledo.

Mr. Krupp, veteran of World War I, became ill in his home in Toledo Tuesday night after returning from an American Legion dinner. He was taken to a hospital where he underwent an operation Wednesday for relief of strangulation of the bowels.

His death occurred about 7 o'clock this morning, relatives here were informed.

He was born in Carey and came to Tiffin as a young man, working as a baker at the Grill bakery. He was married to Virginia Scott of this city while a resident of Tiffin. Later he moved to Carey where he learned the machinist's trade and then moved to Toledo where he had since resided.

During his residence here he was active among musicians and played an alto horn with the Second Regiment, Ohio National Guard, band. He frequently visited here and attended reunions of local bandsmen each summer.

Surviving are his wife, four brothers and two sisters.

Funeral arrangements were incomplete today.
