N. HAVEN, CONN.**

**Well Known Ex-Sanduskian
Was Son of Late
Chas. J. Krupp.**

The Ed P. Quick Funeral Home, E. Washington-st, was advised by telephone shortly before 2 o'clock this afternoon, of the death at noon today in a hospital in New Haven, Conn., of Ira Krupp, 54, son of the late Charles J. Krupp and, like his father, a one-time well known Sanduskian. *Fr. Aug. 16-35*

Mr. Krupp had been in failing health for some time and in the hospital for a number of weeks.

The remains will arrive in Sandusky for burial Monday morning at 9:50.

A sister of Mr. Krupp, Mrs. Tom Hicks, is at the home of Mrs. Charles J. Krupp, this city.

**Body To Arrive Monday
From New Haven, Conn.**

The body of Ira Krupp, former well-known resident of Sandusky, will arrive here Monday morning at 9:50 o'clock over the New York Central railroad and will be taken to Oakland Cemetery where burial will be made following services at the grave to be conducted by the Rev. Gates E. M. Young, rector of Calvary Episcopal Church.

Mr. Krupp, who had been living in the east for a number of years, was a son of the late Charles J. Krupp, for many years an undertaker here.

Mr. Krupp had been in poor health for some time, according to word received here by relatives, and his death occurred at noon yesterday in a New Haven hospital where he had been a patient for a number of weeks. For a number of years while living here, Mr. Krupp resided on a farm on S. Hayes-av.

He is survived by his widow, and a sister, Mrs. Thomas Hicks, who is now visiting here at the home of Mrs. Charles J. Krupp.

Burial arrangements here are in charge of the Quick Funeral Home.

Services were conducted at the grave in the Lane lot in Oakland cemetery Monday morning by the Rev. Gates E. M. Young of Calvary Episcopal church for Ira Krupp, former resident of Sandusky who died Friday in New Haven, Conn.

The body arrived here Monday morning at 8:50 o'clock over the New York Central railroad and was taken immediately to the cemetery.

Mrs. Susan Keegan Krupp, 80, widow of Jacob S., a former resident of Sandusky and Huron and for the past year and a half living in Canton, died Saturday morning at Mercy Hospital in Canton.

Mrs. Krupp is survived by two daughters, Sister M. Charlotte, C. S. Mrs. Mary Buyer Krupp, 81, pioneer Sanduskian and widow of Charles J., former local funeral director, died Wednesday evening in Providence Hospital after a brief illness. *Wed. Dec. 23*

Mrs. Krupp was born Sept. 24, 1867, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Buyer, who also were native Sanduskians. She was a member of the Sandusky Public Library Board, the Delphian Club, a charter member of the Business Women's Club, and a member of SS. Peter and Paul Catholic Church and where she was at one time organist. She resided at 605 Jackson-st.
