## Herman Schreiner, 39, Killed at Carey

Herman Schreiner, 39, of  
120 High street, Carey, for-  
mer village street commis-  
sioner, carpenter at the Na-  
tional Lime & Stone Co. plant,  
was almost instantly killed at  
9:45 a. m. Sunday when he  
fell 65 feet into the pit of the  
quarry.

Schreiner was handling timber  
with other workmen at the top of  
the crusher building when his glove  
caught on a heavy timber as it was  
being thrown out of the building.  
He was jerked violently out and fell  
into the pit, striking a cable 15 feet  
from the ground. His neck and left  
leg were broken, and death oc-  
curred almost instantly.

Mr. Schreiner was born in Huron  
county, June 29, 1898, to Martin and  
Anna (Krupp) Schreiner who are  
now deceased. He had resided in  
Carey for the past 16 years and was  
married there in April, 1923, to  
Martha Neiderkahr. Surviving are  
his wife, five children, Howard, Eu-  
gene, Herman, Jr., Melvin and Ma-  
rie; and the following brothers and  
sisters, Anthony, Battle Creek,  
Mich.; Mrs. Rachael Brickner, Fos-  
toria; Mrs. Joseph Elmlinger, Hav-  
ana, O.; Mrs. Fred Claus, Attica;  
Mrs. Charles Yost, Atlantic City,

Mrs. Schreiner is a sister of Mrs.  
George Steinmetz, of this city.

Funeral service are to be held at  
10 a. m. Thursday in Our Lady of
