

HOLD FUNERAL OF MRS. SCHREINER SAT. MORNING

DEATH OF BELLEVUE WOMAN,
WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON FOL-
LOWED OPERATION.

Unexpected complications, following an operation which was performed a week earlier, caused the death in Bellevue hospital yesterday afternoon of Mrs. Michael Schreiner, Green street, whose funeral will be held Saturday morning at 9:30 from the Immaculate Conception Catholic church, Rev. F. A. Terwoord officiating. Interment will be in the Catholic cemetery here.

Mrs. Schreiner had been a resident of Bellevue for two years prior to death, previous to which time she had resided in Frank for many years. She was a native of Peru, where she was born, September 20, 1866, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Sickinger, and was christened Mary Magdalen. During her early life she moved with her parents to Monroeville and there was united in marriage to Mr. Schreiner on January 29, 1891, they taking up housekeeping in Frank, where they resided until two years ago, when they moved to Bellevue. She was a lifelong member of the Catholic church and a member of the Altar society of the Bellevue church. In the midst of her neighbors and friends she was esteemed as a valued neighbor and a cherished acquaintance, whose passing is the occasion for deep sorrow.

Surviving are the husband, one son, Joseph, residing on the homestead farm at Frank, and two brothers, Edward and William Sickinger, both residents of Norwalk.
