

# NELLIE SCHREINER IS TAKEN BY DEATH

## Was Sterling Employe for 50 Years

Miss Nellie M. Schreiner, 73, died at 4:20 p.m. Wednesday in her home at 69 Wentz street. She had been in failing health for three years and her condition became serious about six weeks ago following a stroke.

Miss Schreiner was born Aug. 6, 1875 to Andrew and Sarah (Dick) Schreiner. She was an employe of the Sterling Grinding Wheel organization for 50 years, serving as secretary and assistant treasurer prior to 1922 when ownership of the plant was acquired by the Cleveland Quarries Company, and a bookkeeper after that time until she retired in April 1945.

She was appointed to the position of secretary at the Sterling in 1902 when the plant had only two kilns and less than 50 employes. Her father built the first kiln at the plant and his son was the builder of the last one put into service. During her half century of service bookkeeping at the plant evolved from a primitive system to an elaborately mechanized modern calculating and recording system.

She was a graduate of Tiffin high school in the last class which went to high school in the Monroe street building before Columbian high school was built.

Miss Schreiner is survived by a sister, Clara, at home, a cousin, Miss Lillian Dunn, who also made her home with her, and two nieces and a nephew, Dr. Lillian Kramer, Detroit; Mrs. Della Atcheson, and R. C. Huber, Southgate, Calif. A sister and brother, Mrs. Charles Huber and William Schreiner, are deceased. Miss Schreiner was a member of Trinity E. and R. Church and of Circle One and the Loyal Class of the Sunday school.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday in the Karl Bame Funeral home and will be conducted by the Rev. Dr. J. W. Myers. Burial will be made in Greenlawn cemetery. Friends may call at the Bame funeral home after 7 p.m. this evening.
